A BILL  
ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

The 2006-2007 Current Expense Budget  
General Fund  
Police Department

FOR the purpose of amending the 2006-2007 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the  
General Fund monies derived from unreserved, undesignated General Fund  
Surplus as of June 30, 2006.

WHEREAS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH Section 712 of the Baltimore County  
Charter, the County Council may make supplementary appropriations from unexpended  
and unencumbered funds set aside for contingencies in the county budget; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department's Operations Program has experienced  
personnel costs in excess of the amount  
projected in the original 2006-2007 Current

Expense Budget; now therefore

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Section 712 of the Baltimore County Charter and that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, be and is hereby amended by appropriating unreserved, undesignated General Fund Surplus in the amount herein specified, to the following program:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect March 5, 2007
