# BALTIMORE COUNTY COUNCIL MINUTES LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2011, LEGISLATIVE DAY NO. 21 December 19, 2011 6:00 P.M.

**A.** The meeting was called to order by Chairman Olszewski at 6:00 P.M. The Chairman asked the audience to rise for a moment of silent meditation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag led by Guy Almony of Scout Troop 355 and his sister Kayleigh Gott. #### B. APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

Upon motion by Councilman Huff, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, the reading of the Journal Entries for the meeting of December 5, 2011 was waived and accepted unanimously.

#### C. ENROLLMENT OF BILLS

The Chairman stated that the following Bills were passed by the County Council and signed by the County Executive. He certified and delivered to the Secretary, Bills 72-11, 73-11 and 74-11.

#### D. INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

**BILL 80-11,** entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the 2011-2012 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from state funds and made available to the County through the Governor's Office on Crime Control and Prevention.

#### E. CALL OF BILLS FOR FINAL READING AND VOTE

<u>**Bill 75-11, Ethics Law Amendments, was called. Council woman Bevins moved to amend this Bill with the following amendments:</u></u>**

On page 10, in line 8, strike "(D)" and substitute "(C)"; on page 12, strike lines 8 through 22, and strike page 13, and on page 14, strike lines 1 through 10; in lines 11 and 19, strike "(C)" and (D)", respectively, and substitute "(B)" and "(C)", respectively; and on page 15, in line 6 strike "(E)" and substitute "(D)"
- 2. On page 18, in lines 3 and 8, before the word "COMPENSATION", insert in each instance "CONTINGENT"

- 3. On page 21, in lines 2 and 4, strike "COUNTY" and substitute in each instance "PUBLIC OFFICIAL'S OFFICE, AGENCY, BOARD, OR COMMISSION"
- 4. On page 22, in lines 1 and 2, strike "1. FOR A PUBLIC OFFICIAL OTHER THAN MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL,"; and strike lines 4 through 12, inclusive
- 5. On page 23, in line 12, strike "FROM THE PERSON SPONSORING OR CONDUCTING THE EVENT,"; on page 38, in line 9, strike "BY THE PERSON SPONSORING OR CONDUCTING THE EVENT"; and strike lines 11 through 19, and substitute "SPORTING OR POLITICAL EVENT."

A contract with Francis Miller, Jr and Michelle Phillips, to acquire an agricultural easement, located at 19038 Graystone Road, Baltimore, Maryland 21161, for the protection of farmland through the County Agricultural Land Preservation Program.

# 5. <u>Contract - Hartley & Dorothy Justice - Agricultural Easement - Real Estate</u> <u>Compliance</u>

A contract with Hartley and Dorothy Justice, to acquire a conservation easement containing 20.01 acres, more or less, located at 13201 Long Green Pike, Baltimore, Maryland 21082, for the protection of agricultural natural resources in the Long Green Valley area.

# 6. <u>Contract - S. Stevens Sands, Jr. & Rosa Beckwith Sands - Agricultural Easement - Protection of Farmland - Real Estate Compliance</u>

A contract with S. Stevens Sands, Jr. and Rosa Beckwith Sands, to acquire an agricultural easement, located at 13601 Mantua Mill Road, Glyndon, Maryland 21071, for the protection of farmland through the County Agricultural Land Preservation Program.

#### 7. Contract - County Council - Sage Policy Group, Inc. - Economic Forecasting Services

A contract with Sage Policy Group, Inc., for economic forecasting services.

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to authorize the County to accept a gift of money from the State of Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, Emergency Number Systems Board. Keith Dorsey appeared. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Huff, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

## 3. <u>Petition for Condemnation - Hunter's Moon LLC - Stablers Church Road - LFG Migration</u>

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read the correspondence from the Administrative Officer of a complaint for condemnation with Hunter's Moon, LLC, to acquire land adjacent to the Parkton landfill, located on Stablers Church Road, Parkton, Maryland 21120, for the purpose of remediation associated with possible LFG migration. Upon motion by Councilman Huff, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this condemnation was tabled by the following roll call vote:

There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Grant Agreement was approved by the following roll call vote:

#### 6. Res. 133-11 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Sam M. Zannino

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Sam M. Zannino who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

#### 7. Res. 134-11 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - David L. McCorkle

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from David L. McCorkle who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

#### 8. Res. 135-11 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Salvatore J. Fusco, Jr.

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Salvatore J. Fusco, Jr. who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Huff, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved.
