### BALTIMORE COUNTY COUNCIL MINUTES LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2014, LEGISLATIVE DAY NO. 18 November 3, 2014 6:00 P.M.

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**A.** The meeting was called to order by Chair Bevins at 6:12 P.M. The Chair asked the audience to rise for a moment of silent meditation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. #### B. APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

#### D. INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

#### F. APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS

The Chair stated that the Council would now consider Fiscal Matters. Extensive testimony on each item was taken at the Council's work session on October 28, 2014. The witnesses who testified at the work session were available to restate their testimony if needed. If a Councilmember had any questions regarding a particular Fiscal Matter, that item would be discussed as a separate matter. Chair Bevins then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letter for Fiscal Matters 1 through 5.

## 1. Amendment to Contract - Medical Priority Consultants, Inc. - Training and certification courses-911 training programs - OBF

An amendment to the contract with Medical Priority Consultants, Inc., to provide training and certification courses for required 911 training programs, to increase the total compensation amount and to change the renewal terms to 9 one-year periods.

#### 2. Amendments to Contracts - (3) - On-call electrical services - OBF

Three contracts to increase the total compensation cap, allowing the contractors to continue to provide on-call electrical services. The need has grown by far beyond the original estimate and the compensation cap is insufficient.

# 3. Contracts - (3) - Implementation of reforestation projects - Phase II Watershed Implementation Program - DEPS

Three contracts to provide for the implementation of reforestation projects for application of the County's Phase II Watershed Implementation Plan. Provided services will include site preparation, tree planting, and site and tree maintenance for tree planting projects for urban/suburban areas throughout Baltimore County.

## 4. Contract - Cintas Corporation No. 2 - Rent al and laundering of uniforms - VOM - Public Works

A contract with Cintas Corporation No. 2, to provide for the rental and laundering of uniforms for the operating personnel of Vehicle Operations Maintenance and Highways/Equipment Maintenance; and the rental of rags, used by the same contractors, to clean up liquid spills.

#### 5. Contract - Friends Medical Laboratory, Inc. - Drug and alcohol testing services - HHS

A contract with Friends Medical Laboratory, Inc., to provide drug and alcohol testing services to uninsured and Baltimore County residents.

There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilman Olszewski, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, Fiscal Matters 1 through 5 were unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### G. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

#### 1. Res. 97-14 - Accept donation for Arbutus Recreation Center

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to authorize the County to accept a donation of Twenty-Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000) from the Arbutus Recreation Council. Barry Williams appeared. Councilman Quirk commented. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### 2. Res. 99-14 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - William T. Wallace

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from William T. Wallace who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### 3. Res. 100-14 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Larry Thompson

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Larry Thompson who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Olszewski, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### 4. Res. 101-14 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Frank W. Caldwell, Sr.

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Frank W. Caldwell, Sr. who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### 5. Res. 102-14 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Richard F. Mast

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Richard F. Mast who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.

#### 6. Res. 103-14 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Charles B. Elliott

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Charles B. Elliott who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Oliver, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved by the six Councilmembers present.
