### BALTIMORE COUNTY COUNCIL MINUTES LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2014, LEGISLATIVE DAY NO. 12 July 7, 2014 6:00 P.M.

#### F. APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS

## 1. Agreement - Elaine C. Katz - Professional Services/Executive Director Baltimore County Ethics Commission - Law

An agreement with Elaine C. Katz, to provide her professional services, and serve as the Executive Director of the Baltimore County Ethics Commission.

# 2. Contract - Homeland Security & Management Solutions dba Dantli Corp - On-site certified interpretation and transcription services - Police

A contract with Homeland Security and Management Solutions d/b/a Dantli Corp, to provide onsite certified interpretation and transcription services of witnesses, victims, and/or suspects for the Police Department in Homeland Security.

## 3. <u>Contract - ALS Group USA Corporation, dba ALS Environmental - Laboratory</u> analysis - Environmental samples - Public Works

A contract with ALS Group USA Corporation, d/b/a ALS Environmental, to provide laboratory analysis of environmental samples collected by the contractor or County personnel from the municipal solid waste landfill sites, in support of remediation, monitoring and investigation projects.

# 4. <u>Contract - Lighting Maintenance, Inc. - Maintenance/repair lighting systems at athletic fields, courts & parks - Rec. & Parks</u>

A contract with Lighting Maintenance, Inc, to provide the maintenance and repair of lighting systems at athletic fields, courts and parks throughout Baltimore County.

## 5. <u>Contract - Advantage Engineers, LLC - Design & engineering services - Inter-County Broadband Network - OIT</u>

A contract with Advantage Engineers, LLC, to provide design and engineering services for the inter-county broadband network fiber optic infrastructure project, to build as much as 850 miles of fiber optics and directly connect over 650 community anchor institutions (schools, libraries, government buildings, community colleges, public safety agencies, etc).

A contract with Manolis Painting Company, to provide lead abatement and painting services for the historic iron fence, at Battle Acre Park, in Dundalk, Maryland.

A contract with Arc Environmental, Inc., to provide lead hazard risk assessments in Baltimore County residences.

## 12. <u>Contracts - (2) - Randomized controlled trial evaluation - statistical evidence - Accelerating Connections to Employment (ACE) Initiative - E&WD</u>

Two contacts with ICF Incorporated, LLC and Social Solutions Global, Inc., to implement a randomized controlled trail evaluation, that will provide statistical evidence for the Accelerating Connections to Employment (ACE) initiative, for which the County received a grant from the U.S. Department of Labor, Employment and Training.

### 13. <u>Amendment to Contract - Associated Catholic Charities, Inc. d/b/a Villa Maria</u> Continuum - Family and Kinship Navigation Services - HHS

A contract with Associated Prologue, Inc., to provide services to Baltimore County adults who are being discharged from a state psychiatric hospital.

A contract with Associated Advanced Fire Protection Systems, LLC, to provide the maintenance and repair of fire sprinkler systems in Baltimore County facilities.

A contract with B & J Sweeping and Sons, Inc., to provide street sweeping services for Eastern Baltimore County.

An agreement with Electric Motor Repair Company, to provide labor materials and preventive maintenance for the Department of Corrections kitchen equipment.

A contract with Sentinel Offender Services, LLC, to provide home monitoring and equipment services for Baltimore County inmates sentenced to home detention.

### 22. <u>Contract of Sale - Weslie John Hinegardner, Jr. - 5017 Hornago Avenue - Perry Hall -</u> Real Estate Compliance

A contract of sale with Weslie John Hinegardner, Jr., to acquire a parcel of land, located at 5017 Hornago Avenue, Perry Hall, Maryland 21128; for the extension of the sanitary sewer to 5 properties with failing septic systems.

- 2. On page 2, in the fourth WHEREAS clause, after "Grange Elementary School", insert "and a monetary contribution of a minimum of twenty-five (25%) of the total cost, and sufficient when combined with other funding identified by the County, to fully fund all work required to construct a full-sized synthetic turf multi-purpose field and lights on County-owned property in the same recreation council district"

- 3. On page 5, in paragraph 6, after "No", strike "hookah lounges, bail bondsman businesses, or tattoo parlors" and substitute "liquor stores, pawn shops, tattoo or body piercing establishments, massage establishments, adult entertainment businesses, hookah or vapor lounges, bail bondsman businesses, check cashing businesses, stand alone cigarette or liquor sales, or service garages".
