BILL 1-15, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the 2014-2015 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from federal funds and made available to the County through the Department of Health and Human Services Center for Disease Control.

BILL 2-15, entitled An Act for the purpose of establishing the Baltimore County Animal Services Advisory Commission and its purpose; specifying its composition and the appointment of its members; providing for officers, meetings, and rules of the Commission; setting forth the Commission's duties and responsibilities; providing for reports of the Commission; specifying terms for the initial members of the Commission; requiring the Animals Services Division to keep and maintain certain records; and generally relating to the Baltimore County Animal Services Advisory Commission and the Animal Services Division.

<u>BILL 3-15</u>, entitled An Act for the of purpose repealing the prohibition on the continued payment of a line of duty death benefit to a deceased member's surviving spouse if the surviving spouse remarries; and generally relating to the line of duty death benefit for the surviving spouse of a deceased member of the retirement system.
