- 3. On page 3, in line 8, after "2015" insert "and shall apply to Commercial Revitalization Districts established by County Council resolution prior to the effective date of this Act"

F. APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS

The Chair stated that the Council would now consider Fiscal Matters. Extensive testimony on each item was taken at the Council's work session on October 27, 2015 The witnesses who testified at the work session were available to restate their testimony if needed. If a Councilmember had any questions regarding a particular Fiscal Matter, that item would be discussed as a separate matter. Chair Bevins then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letters for Fiscal Matters 1 through 5.

1. Contracts - (2) - On-call snow removal, de-icing and salt application - DPW

A contract with Blake and Sons Contracting, LLC and J & J Truck and Trailer, to provide snow-removal, de-icing and salt application services on an on-call, as-needed basis.

2. Contract - E.J. Herring & Son, Inc. - Chiller maintenance -Baltimore County facilities - OBF

A contract with E.J. Herring & Son, Inc., to provide chiller maintenance at various Baltimore County facilities. The contractor shall provide all necessary labor, supervision, equipment, material, tools and all related incidentals required to maintain and provide minor repairs to chillers in the County facilities.

3. Amendment to Contract - Mar-Len Environmental, Inc. - Professional forestry services - DEPS

An amendment to the contract with Mar-Len Environmental, Inc., to increase the total compensation amount during the entire term of the agreement, including renewals. The contractor will continue to provide professional forestry services for Baltimore County, including reforestation projects for the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan program.

4. <u>Contract of Sale - Julius Adeleke - 3114 Rolling Road, 21244 - Widening of Rolling Road</u> - Real Estate Compliance

A contract of sale with Julius Adeleke, to acquire a parcel of land and necessary easements, located at 3114 Rolling Road, Windsor Mill, Maryland 21244, for the widening of Rolling Road.

5. Addendum to Contract - A. Morton Thomas & Associates, Inc. - Professional civil engineering/site design services-OBF

An amendment to the contract with A. Morton Thomas and Associates, Inc., to increase the total compensation amount. The contractor will continue to furnish professional civil engineering/site design services to prepare studies, preliminary designs and contract documents for the site development of buildings and other miscellaneous projects.

Councilman Marks questioned Mr. Dorsey. Councilman Kach questioned Mr. Gardina. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, Fiscal Matters 1 through 5 were unanimously approved.

G. <u>MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS</u>

1. Correspondence - Non-Competitive Awards

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read the correspondence from the Office of Budget and Finance listing the non-competitive awards made during September, 2015.

3. Res. 91-15 - Accept Gift - Pet disaster relief trailer and supplies - AKC Reunite

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to authorize the County to accept a gift of a pet disaster relief trailer and supplies. Della Leister appeared. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Crandell, seconded by Councilman Jones, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

4. Res. 92-15 - Payment in lieu of property taxes - TABCO Towers Housing Associates, LLC

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to authorize the County Executive or other authorized administrative official to enter into a written agreement on behalf of the County with Tabco Towers Housing Associates, LLC (the "Owner") for the payment of stipulated amounts in lieu of regular real property taxes in order to facilitate the development of an housing project to benefit low income households in Baltimore County. Andrea Van Arsdale appeared. Councilman Marks commented. Councilman Kach questioned Ms. Van Arsdale. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

5. Res. 93-15 - Property Tax Exemption - BLIND - Flordeliz R. Paloma

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Flordeliz R. Paloma, who is entitled to a partial exemption from State and County real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to blind persons under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilman Quirk, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

6. Res. 94-15 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Ronald Lavalley

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Ronald Lavalley, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

7. Res. 95-15 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Herbert F. Hiteshew

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Herbert F. Hiteshew, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

8. Res. 96-15 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - JoAnn R. Evans

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from JoAnn R. Evans, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

9. Res. 97-15 - Property Tax Exemption - DAV - Barry S. Hooper

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Barry S. Hooper, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

10. Res. 98-15 - Approval of extension of sanitary sewer system - Middle River area

This Resolution was for introduction only.

11. Res. 99-15 - Planned Unit Development - McDaniel/Strawbridge Commons - Joppa-Chapel Investments, LLC
