B. APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

Upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, the reading of the Journal Entries for the meeting of January 20, 2015 was waived and accepted unanimously.

C. ENROLLMENT OF BILLS

The Chair stated that the following Bills were passed by the County Council and signed by the County Executive. She certified and delivered to the Secretary, Bills 67-14, 68-14, 69-14, 70-14, 71-14, 72-14 and 73-14.

D. <u>INTRODUCTION OF BILLS</u>

- <u>BILL 9-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of establishing the rates for the stormwater management fee for Fiscal Year 2016 and each year thereafter until changed by Executive Order or legislative Act.
- <u>BILL 10-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the 2014-2015 Capital Budget, by appropriating to the Capital Budget monies derived from grant funds and made available to the County through the Harry R. Hughes Center for Agro-Ecology, Inc. (Hughes Center).
- <u>BILL 11-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of expanding the membership of the Employees Retirement System Board of Trustees; specifying qualifications for certain members; and generally relating to the Employees Retirement System Board of Trustees.
- <u>BILL 12-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of establishing a Baltimore County Charter Review Commission to review the provisions of the Charter during certain specified periods and to make recommendations concerning proposed Charter amendments where necessary and appropriate.
- <u>BILL 13-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending certain penalties and enforcement provisions pertaining to the distribution of tobacco products to minors; and generally relating to the distribution of tobacco products to minors.

<u>BILL 14-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of defining a medical clinic to include a state-licensed kidney dialysis center; providing that a kidney dialysis center is not subject to regulation under Article 4C of the Zoning Regulations; and generally relating to medical clinics.

<u>BILL 15-15</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of repealing a provision of the A.S. (Automotive Services) Overlay District regulation that permits certain uses under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the A.S. (Automotive Services) Overlay District.

- 1. On page 3, in line 12, after "RESCUE", insert 'AND ADOPTION".
- 2. On page 7, in line 2, after "ON", insert "ISSUES RELATED TO ANIMAL RESCUE AND ADOPTION AND", and in line 4, after POPULATION", insert "AND ENHANCE ADOPTION OPPORTUNITIES".

Councilman Kach seconded the motion and these amendments passed by the following roll call vote:

Councilman Jones then moved to amend this Bill with the following amendments:

On page 4, in line 10, strike "(1) ONE MEMBER SHALL BE" and substitute "1. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE EITHER ONE OF THE FOLLOWING: A."; in line 11, strike "(2) ONE MEMBER SHALL BE" and substitute "B."; in lines 11 and 12, strike "AN ANIMAL WELFARE" and substitute "A HUMANE"; in line 12, after "ORGANIZATION", insert "OR"; in line 13, strike "(3) ONE MEMBER SHALL BE" and substitute "C."; in line 15, strike "(4)" and substitute "2."; and in the same line, strike both references to "MEMBER" and substitute "MEMBERS".

On page 5, in line 17, before the first "THE", insert "(A)".

On page 6, in line 2, strike "ANIMAL WELFARE", and substitute "HUMANE"; in lines 6 and 17, strike the period and substitute a semi-colon; in line 11, after "(4)", insert "SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION,"; in the same line, after the first "THE", insert "COUNTY"; in the same line, strike "SERVICES FACILITY OF THE COUNTY" and substitute "SHELTER DURING HOURS THAT THE SHELTER IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC"; in line 12, strike "INSPECT" and substitute "OBSERVE"; in the same line, after "PHASES", insert "AND AREAS"; strike from "FACILITY." in line 13 through "FACILITY." in line 15 and substitute "SHELTER;"; and in line 16, after "(5)", insert "SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THE MARYLAND PUBLIC INFORMATON ACT,".

On page 7, in lines 1 and 17, strike "SERVICES FACILITY" and substitute "SHELTER"; and after line 6, insert:

"(B)(1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A MEMBER WHO INTENDS TO VISIT A PART OF THE ANIMAL SHELTER THAT IS NOT NORMALLY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

- (2) A MEMBER SHALL COORDINATE THE VISIT WITH THE DIRECTOR OF THE SHELTER NOT LESS THAN 4 HOURS IN ADVANCE.
- (3) A MEMBER MAY NOT BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PERSON WHO IS NOT A MEMBER DURING A VISIT AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- (4) A MEMBER MAY NOT VISIT THE QUARANTINE ROOM.
- (5) IF THE VISIT IS EXPECTED TO LAST MORE THAN TWO HOURS, THE DIRECTOR OF THE SHELTER AND THE MEMBER MUST SECURE THE PERMISSION OF THE HEALTH OFFICER OR THE HEALTH OFFICER'S DESIGNEE."

On page 8, in line 13, strike "SERVICES FACILITY" and substitute "SHELTER".

Councilwoman Almond seconded the motion and these amendments passed by the following roll call vote:

F. APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS

The Chair stated that the Council would now consider Fiscal Matters. Extensive testimony on each item was taken at the Council's work session on January 27, 2015. The witnesses who testified at the work session were available to restate their testimony if needed. If a Councilmember had any questions regarding a particular Fiscal Matter, that item would be discussed as a separate matter. Chair Bevins then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letters for Fiscal Matters 1 through 8.

1. Contract - Facility Logix, LLC - Consulting services - research & development- viable ecosystem for entrepreneurs-DEWD

A contract with Facility Logix, LLC, to provide consulting services, to conduct research and develop a blueprint for the creation of a viable ecosystem for entrepreneurs in Baltimore County. The overall goal being to create jobs and to grow the County's economy.

2. Contract - Petroleum Services, Inc. - Fuel tank services - OBF

A contract with Petroleum Services, Inc., to provide fuel tank services, both above and underground, including repairs, soil sample tests, fuel sample tests, and filtering to remove microorganisms.

3. Amendment to Contract - Dazser-Bal Corporation - Janitorial services - OBF

An amendment to the contract with Dazser-Bal Corporation, to increase the total compensation paid to the contractor due to an exponential and unpredicted increase in the use of these services; as additional locations are also now being serviced.

4. <u>Contract - Midlantic Marking, Inc. - On-call services - line-striping roadway pavements - Public Works</u>

A contract with Midlantic Marking, Inc., to provide on-call services for line-striping of roadway pavements, according to the specifications and rate set forth in its Maryland Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration contract number 492D71471, the Baltimore County wishes to piggyback from.

5. Contract - Columbia Telecommunications Corporation - Broadband Technology Opportunities Program - OIT

A contract with Columbia Telecommunications Corporation, to develop a dark broadband fiber lease model and business plan to assist the County in documenting its compliance with the federal Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP) grant requirements, in developing required programs, in working on the application and tracking of any waivers the County may wish to request, in identifying additional avenues for partnerships and revenue generations related to the broadband fiber network, and assisting with managing the total cost of ownership of the entire infrastructure.

6. <u>Amendment to Contract - Dewberry Consultants, LLC - Geographic Mapping Services - OIT</u>

An amendment to the contract with Dewberry Consultants, LLC, to add an additional one-year of continued services are requested, while the County works on a new request for proposal for geographic mapping services.

7. Contracts - (3) - Senior Housing Complexes - Congregate Meal Program - Aging

Three contracts to enter into agreements with 3 management companies of senior housing complexes, that would permit the county to provide the congregate meal program at a particular complex. The contractor will provide and maintain a dining facility in which meals are served to eligible residents, provide supervisory personnel while meals are being served and facilitate other aspects of the program, such as scheduling, recruiting volunteers and registering participants. No money is exchanged between parties.

8. <u>Contract - Life Technologies Corporation - Validation Services - Applied Biosystems</u> 3500 genetic analyzers - Police

A contract with Life Technologies Corporation, to provide validation services of the applied biosystems 3500 genetic analyzers for the forensic services section.

Councilmembers Quirk and Jones commented. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilman Marks, Fiscal Matters 1 through 8 were unanimously approved.

1. Correspondence - Non-Competitive Awards

2. Res. 5-15 - Amending Boundaries - Pikesville Commercial Revitalization District

At the direction of the Chair, the Secretary read this Resolution of the Baltimore County Council for the purpose of amending the boundaries of the Pikesville Commercial Revitalization District. Councilwoman Almond commented. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Almond, seconded by Councilman Marks, this Resolution was unanimously approved.
