F. APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS

The Chairwoman stated that the Council would now consider Fiscal Matters. Extensive testimony on each item was taken at the Council's work session on November 29, 2016. The witnesses who testified at the work session were available to restate their testimony if needed. If a Councilmember had any questions regarding a particular Fiscal Matter, that item would be discussed as a separate matter. Chairwoman Almond then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letter for Fiscal Matters 1 through 4.

1. Contract – Maryland Office of the Public Defender – Assistant Public Defender II – DOC

A contract with the Maryland Office of the Public Defender, that will identify an Assistant Public Defender II to provide services for the pretrial inmates incarcerated in the Baltimore County Detention Center. The Public Defender will interview and review case files of defendants; then identify and arrange for alternatives to pretrial incarceration.

2. <u>Contract – Wood, Stear and Ledoux, Inc. d/b/a Cleaning Technology-maintenance/repairs Plymo-Vent vehicle exhaust systems-OBF</u>

A contract with Wood, Stear and Ledoux, Incorporated d/b/a Air Cleaning Technology, to provide preventative maintenance and repairs to the Plymo-Vent vehicle exhaust systems, located in County fire stations.

3. Contracts – (3) – Snow Removal Services - OBF

Three contracts with Suncoast Landscaping, LLC, Classic Lawn and Landscape, Ltd and Maryland Hauling and Recovery, LLC, to provide snow removal services at Baltimore County libraries and other County sites throughout Baltimore County.

4. Contract – Advanced Imaging Partners, Inc. – Evaluations/x-rays related to Tuberculosis cases - HHS

A contract with Advanced Imaging Partners, Inc., to provide evaluations for our active Tuberculosis cases including a baseline chest x-ray and an end of treatment chest x-ray for comparison.

There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, Fiscal Matters 1 through 4 were unanimously approved.

1. Correspondence - Non-Competitive Awards

2. Res. 132-16 – Property Tax Exemption – DAV – Edward R. Ostrowski

Ostrowski, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilman Kach, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

3. Res. 133-16 – Property Tax Exemption – DAV – Carl Beaver, Jr.

At the direction of the Chairwoman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Carl Beaver, Jr., who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Almond, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

4. Res. 134-16 – Property Tax Exemption – DAV – Tyrone C. Lewis

Lewis, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law.
