#### BALTIMORE COUNTY COUNCIL MINUTES LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2017, LEGISLATIVE DAY NO. 6 March 20, 2017 6:00 P.M.

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**A.** The meeting was called to order by Chairman Quirk at 6:01 P.M. The Chairman asked the audience to rise for a moment of silent meditation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag led by Boy Scout Troop #729 of Woodbrook. #### **B.** APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

Upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Almond, the reading of the Journal Entries for the meeting of March 6, 2017 was waived and accepted unanimously.

#### C. <u>ENROLLMENT OF BILLS</u>

The Chairman stated that the following Bills were passed by the County Council and signed by the County Executive. He certified and delivered to the Secretary, Bills 3-17, 4-17, 5-17, 6-17 and 8-17.

#### D. INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

**BILL 13-17**, entitled An Act for the purpose of permitting a Solar Facility to be located in certain zones of the County by special exception; defining terms; providing for the requirements for a facility; providing for a required security; providing for the maintenance, abandonment, and removal of a facility; authorizing the Code Official to enforce the provisions of this Act; providing exceptions; providing for the application of the Act; and generally relating to Solar Facilities.

<u>BILL 14-17</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the uses permitted in the Neighborhood Commons Overlay District by right and by special exception; clarifying the application of the Overlay District; and generally relating to the Neighborhood Commons Overlay District.

#### E. <u>CALL OF BILLS FOR FINAL READING AND VOTE</u>

<u>**Bill 10-17,**</u> CEB – Linkage to Care, was called. Kevin Reed appeared. There being no discussion, this Bill passed by the following roll call vote:

#### F. <u>APPROVAL OF FISCAL MATTERS</u>

The Chairman stated that the Council would now consider Fiscal Matters. Extensive testimony on each item was taken at the Council's work session on March 15, 2017. The witnesses who testified at the work session were available to restate their testimony if needed. If a Councilmember had any questions regarding a particular Fiscal Matter, that item would be discussed as a separate matter. Chairman Quirk then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letters for Fiscal Matters 1 through 5 and 7 though 11. Fiscal Matters 6 and 12 were discussed as separate matters.

#### 1. <u>Contract – Mintz Productions Group, LLC – Hostage Negotiation Team – Annual</u> <u>Training Seminar -PD</u>

A contract with Mintz Productions Group, LLC, to provide the labor, materials, tools, equipment, supervision and technicians for audio/visual presentations for the Police Department Hostage Negotiation Team's annual training seminar.

# 2. <u>Contracts – (2) – Performance of utility infrastructure inspections and cleaning services</u> <u>- DPW</u>

Two contracts with Mobile Dredging & Video Pipe Services, Inc. and Pipe and Plant Solutions, Inc., to provide all labor, materials, supervision, equipment, services, incidentals and related items needed to perform utility infrastructure inspections and cleaning services in compliance with bid and the County's standards for construction.

# 3. <u>Contract – Popowski Brothers, Inc. d/b/a PBI Restorations – Emergency fire/water</u> <u>mitigation services - OBF</u>

A contract with Popowski Brothers, Inc. d/b/a PBI Restoration, to provide all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals to perform emergency fire/water mitigation services in Baltimore County facilities.

# 4. <u>Contract – Ryan Teeter d/b/a Leading Design and Development, LLC – GMAX Testing</u> <u>of synthetic turf fields-OBF</u>

A contract with Ryan teeter d/b/a Leading Design and Development, LLC, to provide GMAX testing and synthetic turf fields countywide.

# 5. <u>Contract – Microwave Networks, Inc. – On-call repair of microwave radios-Electronic</u> <u>Services – OIT</u>

A contract with Microwave Networks, Inc., to provide services repairing microwave radios for Baltimore County electronic services on an on-call, as-needed basis.

# 7. <u>Contract – Cross Match Technologies, Inc. – Hardware/software support, upgrades –</u> <u>LiveScan fingerprint systems-OIT</u>

An amendment to the contract with Cross Match Technologies, Inc., to increase the total compensation cap and extend the current term with (5) one year renewal periods.

# 8. <u>Amendment to Contract – Council of State Governments, LTD – Phase II – Crisis</u> <u>Response System (BCCRS) – OIT</u>

An amendment to the contract with Council of State Governments, LTD, to increase the scope of work, allowing Phase II of the project to be implemented. The scope of work for Phase II entails further analysis and will provide a plan for implementing the recommendations.

# 9. <u>Contracts – (5) – Assistance-Low-income first-time homebuyers – Settlement Expense</u> <u>Loan Program (SELP) – DP</u>

Five contracts to provide assistance to prospective low- and moderate-income first-time home buyers whose incomes are equal to or below 80% of the area median income. The assistance involves education and counseling services as well as administration of the Settlement Expense Loan Program (SELP), which provides down payment and closing assistance.

# 10. <u>Contract of Sale – 8911 Kelso Drive, LLC – Acquisition of easement – Brien Run Sewer</u> <u>Line – REC</u>

A contract of sale with 8911 Kelso Drive, LLC, to purchase an easement with the right of access an adjoining draining and utility easement area. The purpose of this acquisition is for Baltimore County to rehabilitate the Brien Run sewer line.

# 11. <u>Amendment to Contract – Lorenz, Inc. – Mowing/maintenance of athletic fields and</u> <u>parks – OBF</u>

An amendment to the contract with Lorenz, Inc., to extend the final renewal term of the contract for an additional five months - to terminate on November 30, 2017, and to delete Attachment A of the Contract in its entirety and replace it with Attachment A Revision 1. The contractor will continue to provide mowing services and maintenance of athletic fields, parks and other miscellaneous properties in various locations throughout Baltimore County.

There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilman Jones Fiscal Matters 1 through 5 and 7 through 11 were unanimously approved.

Chairman Quirk then called upon the Secretary to read the cover letter for Fiscal Matter 6.

# 6. <u>Contract – Sudina Search, LLC – Recruiting services – Vacancies in essential/highly</u> technical skilled areas-OIT

A contract with Sudina Search, LLC, to provide recruiting services in order to fill essential County vacancies - especially those involving highly technical skill sets. Rob Stradling appeared. Councilmembers Jones and Almond commented. Councilman Jones then motioned to table Fiscal Matter 6. Councilwoman Almond seconded the motion. Thereafter, Fiscal Matter 6 was tabled by the following roll call vote:

Councilmembers Quirk, Almond and Marks commented. Councilman Jones questioned Mr. Dorsey. Councilman Jones then motioned to table Fiscal Matter 12. Councilwoman Bevins seconded the motion. Thereafter, Fiscal Matter 12 was tabled by the following roll call vote:

#### 2. Res. 27-17 - Extension of Sanitary Sewer System - Delight Road - Reisterstown

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution for the purpose of approving the extension of the sanitary sewer system of Baltimore County in the Reisterstown Area, Fourth Election District and Fourth Council District of Baltimore County. Steve Walsh appeared. Councilman Marks questioned Mr. Walsh. There being no further discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Almond, seconded by Councilman Jones, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

#### 3. <u>Res. 28-17 – Planning Board – Review of Regulations on Development Plans and Plats</u>

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution of the Baltimore County Council requesting the Baltimore County Planning Board to review relevant County laws and regulations relating to the applicability of current federal, state, and local standards and regulations to development plans or plats which were approved under previous standards and regulations that have been abrogated or superseded. Councilmembers Bevins and Crandell commented. Councilwoman Bevins then moved to amend this Resolution with the following amendment:

On page 3, insert the following after the second RESOLVED clause:

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Planning Board shall submit its findings and recommendations to the County Council on or before September 20, 2017; and"

# 4. <u>Appointment – Baltimore County Agricultural Preservation Advisory Board –</u> <u>Stephen P. Myer</u>

Myer to the Baltimore County Agricultural Preservation Advisory Board for the remainder of a five year term. Mr. Myer would replace Justin Harrison whose term expires June 30, 2018. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilman Marks, this appointment was unanimously approved.

#### 5. Res. 29-17 - Property Tax Exemption - BLIND - Darlene T. Hohl

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Darlene T. Hohl, who is entitled to a partial exemption from State and County real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to blind persons under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

#### 6. <u>Res. 30-17 – Property Tax Exemption – DAV - Lakeasha S. Mendez</u>

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Lakeasha S. Mendez, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Jones, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

# 7. <u>Res. 31-17 – Property Tax Exemption – DAV – Jerry Kauffman</u>

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this Resolution to approve the refund of certain real property taxes collected from Jerry Kauffman, who is entitled to an exemption from real property taxes by reason of the exemption afforded to disabled veterans under State law. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilwoman Bevins, seconded by Councilman Crandell, this Resolution was unanimously approved.

# 8. <u>Appointment – Baltimore County Ethics Commission – Judge G. Darrell Russell, Jr.</u> <u>Esq.</u>

At the direction of the Chairman, the Secretary read this correspondences from the County Executive requesting the appointment of Judge G. Darrell Russell, Jr., Esq. To the Baltimore County Ethics Commission for the remainder of a three year term. Judge G. Darrell Russell, Jr. Would replace mr. Cary Deeley, whose term expires June 30, 2019. There being no discussion, upon motion by Councilman Marks, seconded by Councilman Jones, this appointment was unanimously approved.
